




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A Message



Youth Dynamics is fully licensed by the State of Montana as a Behavioral Health Center, Child Placing Agency, and Therapeutic Youth Group Home & Youth Shelter Care Provider. We're proud to hold the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) seal of recognition for our quality business, personnel, governance, and clinical practices.

Many of the children and families we serve have experienced trauma. We embrace the ARC framework (Attachment, Regulation, Competency) as our official trauma-informed care model to promote healing and guide our trauma-informed work.

We offer a continuum of mental and behavioral health care, with community service locations providing everything from mentoring to therapy, youth case management, in-home support, therapeutic foster care services, and more. For youth needing a higher level of care, we offer therapeutic group home support via our locations in Billings, Boulder, Helena, and Great Falls.



My dad was killed in 1984 in a trucking accident. I was six. My little sister was five. After he passed away, my mom just kind of went rogue. Just really couldn't handle that situation. We were taking care of ourselves every single day. Making sure my sister had food. To making sure we got to school on time. We were left alone. We didn't really have anybody. You make that your normal. And now we know that's not normal at all. I saw my mom get hauled off. She was put on a stretcher in a straight jacket. I was angry. Like very angry. If it wasn't for Youth Dynamics, I would have been a statistic. That's what I would have been. I would have been another drug addict. I would have been another runaway. From the bottom of my heart, if I wouldn't have had them or even some moments with them it would have been a very different outcome. They're the best thing that ever happened to me.






Many kids we serve come from lower-income households, with behavioral health treatment funded through Medicaid. Key community partnerships include but are not limited to Child & Family Services, Bureau of Indian Affairs, Shodair Children's Hospital, Yellowstone Boys and Girls Ranch, and AWARE.



CHILDREN SERVED FROM JULY 2021 THROUGH JUNE 2022: 2,260

We delivered critical behavioral health care to 2,260 kids across 46 of the 56 counties in Montana, providing an average of 2.4 services within our continuum of care to each child.

BOZEMAN TRANSITIONAL SCHOOL

In partnership with the Bozeman School District, we're proud to support kids through an alternative, therapeutic, educational setting through our Bozeman Transitional School.

With a team that includes a school district teacher and paraprofessional, and a YDI youth case manager, care manager, therapist, and family support assistant, our Bozeman Transitional School serves up to nine kids at any given time—many of which would not graduate high school or complete the HiSet without the program.





THERAPEUTIC FOSTER CARE

Our therapeutic foster care services wrap children up in care, helping them heal and find resilience in the community. The goal of foster care is to support kids in finding permanency—whatever that may look like.

Specialized training for foster parents empowers them to meet kids' unique needs. We deliver support through a team approach, with therapists offering counseling to help heal trauma, care managers providing education and support, youth case managers advocating and coordinating treatment, mentors assisting kids in building valuable skills, and respite providers supporting families to prevent burnout.

We continue to focus on increasing our foster homes to meet the ever-growing needs of kids in care.

OUR RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

When kids have behaviors that affect their ability to safely carry out basic activities at home or in their community, we provide higher levels of support through our ten therapeutic youth homes in Boulder, Billings, Helena, and Great Falls. And for kids staying at our Boulder campus, we also provide specialized day treatment services.

Due to staffing constraints during the pandemic, we temporarily closed our Choices Youth Home in Boulder and Lakeview Youth Home in Billings. In May 2023, we celebrated the reopening of Lakeview with plans to reopen Choices in the near future.

The staff and treatment team helped me realize that I was worth something more than I thought I was. I've learned that if I make a mistake, I can fix it and keep going. I thought it was all over for me, but it wasn't.

SPECIALIZED TREATMENT FOR KIDS IMPACTED BY SEXUAL TRAUMA

Our Boulder campus serves children with diverse needs, including those stemming from sexual trauma. For these youth, we provide the only in-state residential care with MSOTA support & supervision provided by Jake Leeper, LCSW.

A Better Boulder Campus

In 2022, we completed phase one of Reigniting Hope: The Campaign for Youth Dynamics—the most significant fundraising initiative in YDI history. With the support of our donors, we surpassed our \$3 million goal to expand and strengthen behavioral health care for kids in Montana.

Funds raised will go toward expanding youth case management services and updating our Boulder campus—including the construction of a new therapeutic youth home.




Diversity of Kids Served

Most children who turned to us for support are Caucasian at 69.23%, followed by Native American at 21.27%. We continue leveraging cultural competency training to strengthen care and promote positive outcomes for kids.

Average Age of Children Served






Our Impact

Shining a Light on Youth Case Management

Youth Case Management is the conductor of care—orchestrating everything from wrap-around behavioral health services to outside community support, including physical health care such as vision, hearing, and wellness screenings. And outcome data collected shows our case management works!




